


## Innovative and Creative Pedagogies

Innovative and creative teaching practices have proliferated at the University of Exeter over the past 5 years. The Educator Development Team can offer an introduction to and advanced training on a number of innovative and creative teaching approaches such as Lego Serious Play, playful teaching and learning for you to add in to your teaching toolkit!

Educator Development Support

The Educator Development team have already developed workshops and resources on the following innovative and creative pedagogies. We are always developing new workshops and resources, and can also develop bespoke training and support with you.



- **Using Lego Serious Play (LSP) in your teaching**- This session will introduce the principles of LSP, and how to incorporate elements of LSP or LSP activities in to your teaching practice.
- **Playful teaching and learning strategies** - This interactive workshop will explore the ways in which we have incorporated INNOPLAY in to our teaching practice, and how we have developed our own 'games' to create a playful learning environment.
- **The pedagogy of co-creation**- This workshop will explore how to co-create an engaging teaching and learning environment *with* your students.
- **Problem-based learning**- This session introduces problem-based learning - responding to an authentic question or task - to encourage deep learning.
- **Contemplative pedagogies** - XXXXXX
- **Design thinking in teaching**- Design thinking is an iterative, non-linear process that encourages problem-solving and creative thinking. This session will introduce ways to incorporate the principles of design thinking in to your teaching toolkit!
- **Using digital tools differently** - This workshop will introduce a case study on how to use a common digital tool - OneNote - differently as both a synchronous and asynchronous teaching space, and an assessment tool.
